F&B newbie

Laura Crichton has joined our Funding and Benefits team in the Devon office. Here we find out a little bit about her...

How are you finding your new role at SLSW?

As with any new role there is a huge amount to get to grips with, it's probably just as well I don't know the scale of it!But it'll come, and everyone is so friendly and helpful. It has been lovely to meet staff at both offices and even to meet some of the fantastic carers.

Had you heard of SLSW before?

I was aware of SLSW many years ago when it was called SWAPS through a former work colleague. Also in my last job, I was also 'aware' of SLSW as an organisation and its role in providing care services. Since applying, lots of people I know have told me how much they admire the work of the charity and how friendly it is – I am finding that out now from my own experience!

What were you doing before?

I have mainly worked for charities – both national and local. Many moons ago I was



working for a national music and disability organisation, then my experience widened to encompassing benefits advice and health and social care. I have worked for Age UK Information Line, British Red Cross where I set up a Lottery funded project supporting vulnerable people through difficult transitions in their lives, as a Disability Information Officer within Adult Social Services, and for Devon County Council as an Independent Living Adviser in a Direct Payments Team. I've also been a volunteer Cruse bereavement counsellor.

Airports info

We've come across the Civil Aviation Authority's study and report on Supporting people with hidden disabilities at UK airports. In 2016 the CAA published guidance for airports on providing assistance for people with hidden disabilities and gave airports a year to make progress in key areas and developed existing services.

One of the main focus points is giving people with hidden disabilities a lanyard to help staff understand they may need their attention or support. Airports have told the CAA that they have enhanced disability awareness training for customer agents and security staff, so that the training focusses on assisting people

with both visible and nonvisible disabilities. They have also added extra information on the assistance available to their websites and ensured that this is accessible; for example, many airports have produced videos demonstrating the assistance available.

More high profile has been the near universal introduction of optional lanyards or wristbands (or similar discrete identifiers), which are available to be worn by people who may not need one-to-one assistance for the whole passenger journey, but who would like to be able to more easily identify themselves to staff so that they can get extra help at the more stressful touchpoints of the passenger journey, such as security search.

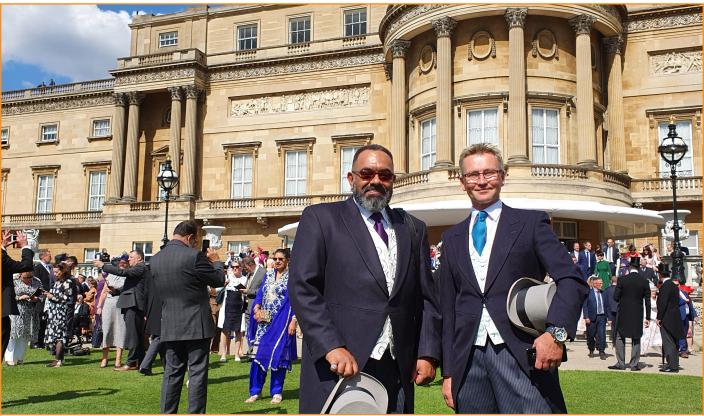








Buckingham Palace garden party invite
